## COURSE OVERVIEW

Colon Cancer Challenge Foundation President Thomas K. Weber, MD, FACS, and Martha Raymond MA, CPN, Executive Director of Michael's Mission and Founder & CEO of The Raymond Foundation are pleased to co-host the Second Annual Early Age Onset Colorectal Cancer Summit.

This event will bring together leading clinicians and researchers as well as early age onset (EAO) colorectal cancer (CRC) survivors and families from across the country. The program will provide extensive opportunities for participants to advance their understanding of the rapidly increasing incidence of rectal and colon cancer among young adults under 50 years of age in the U.S. and abroad.

This ground breaking program will, for a second year, provide both survivors and health care professionals opportunities to leverage each other's insights and provide an opportunity for all to hear "state-of-the-science" presentations on the epidemiology, pathogenesis, genomics and optimal multidisciplinary care of EAO-CRC. In addition, this year's Summit will include a Special Symposium on the Quality of Life challenges young adult CRC patients face.

This meeting will include lectures, workshops and panel discussions designed to facilitate multidisciplinary consensus regarding the priorities of EAO-CRC prevention, clinical care, quality of life and research moving forward.

The Summit will feature keynote addresses from leading clinicians, epidemiologists and researchers from Europe, Africa, Australia and the nation's leading cancer centers and advocacy organizations including Columbia University, MD Anderson Cancer Center, Memorial Sloan Kettering, New York University School of Medicine, the State University of New York Health Sciences Center, the University of California at Berkeley Public Health Institute, the University of Colorado, the University of Pittsburgh, Boston University, Tulane University, the University of Washington, the American Cancer Society, The Health Center Network of New York, Michael's Mission, The Raymond Foundation, New York Legal Assistance Group, Bowel Cancer UK, and the Colon Cancer Challenge Foundation.
